Maybe you have heard that **May, 8 is the International Gypsies' Day.** We planned to do the Evangelizing campaign in Kharkov, Ukraine, on

May, 7; so on May, 6 we came to Kharkov. We traveled about 300 miles from Kursk, Russia.



On the 7th some of our brothers and sisters in Christ from the Gypsy Association arrived to Kharkov and it was a great joy for all of us to meet with one another. The local church did its best to prepare for the campaign. They rented a place, they installed the music equipment and all day long they were spreading the invitations among the Gypsies.



At 5 p.m. our service began. The first speaker was the President of the Gypsy Association Iosioh Lokotosh. After that we showed historical videos which shows how the German Fascists were eliminating the Gypsy people during the Great Patriotic War. The very important thing is that the Lord did not allow them to eliminate all the Gypsies. During all the meeting we were emphasizing that fact.



We worshiped God; we sang praise to Him; we testified about how we had come to the Lord and got our salvation. It was a great privilege for me to preach in the Roma language; and my sermon was translated into Russian so that



our Slavic brothers and sisters could also be filled with the Lord.

When I offered our guests to come forward and to call upon His Name, about 15 people came out and prayed a repentance prayer.

These people do need the Lord! They heard the call of Christ and responded to it. Praise God, in those terrible years of the war the Lord kept my Roma people from the holocaust. And now He is transforming my people!!! Many Gypsies respond to the call of Christ! God is changing their lives!!!

All of them agreed to have their meetings there on Mondays where they would come to listen to the Word that was given by God to the ones who loved Him. Praise the Lord for those who sacrificed their time to come to that meeting. About 150 people came to the meeting that evening.

There were many talks after the meetings; talks from heart to heart; and the youth ministered a lot. After that event we went to the place where we stayed and had a meeting there as well. We also did our ministry there talking with the people who came.

In the morning of May, 8 we were at the Trans World Radio office; this blessed worldwide radiomission recorded the testimonies of all of our youth (there were seven of them).



The next day at 5 a.m. we left Kharkov. On the way we visited my brother Nickolay; we stayed in his place for a short time. We had a meal there and, blessed by my brother, continued our way home. At 3 p.m. we were already at home. And there together with our church we praised the Lord for the trip, for those who had just accepted the Lord and for you, my brother and my sister in Christ, for your kind hearts. We are grateful to you for your prayer and financial support. May the Lord richly bless you with His Grace! Thank you very much!
